Introits

I was really impressed by the response to our Lenten Prose (Hear us O Lord) from everyone. It was awesome to hear the whole church singing in our Lent penitential prayer.

The introits we use change with the liturgical seasons and reflect the nature of worship for which we prepare ourselves in the 5 minutes before the service. ***This is a time of reflective prayer.*** Please continue to join in with the introits, the responses are in the WA. As we are currently in Easter season, the Introit is *Surrexit Christus*.

We mainly use Taize chants, which are a form of spiritual reflection. This does not work so well if people cannot be still and calm their minds. ***Please be mindful of this when you enter the church and keep the peaceful 5 minutes, if not for yourself then in respect of others who are doing so.***

I have had great feedback about moving the choir amongst the congregation, so we will keep doing this in various ways when we can. Singing sends prayers 2 fold (Attributed to St Augustine) elevating the words into a deeper, more emotional form of worship.

An important announcement from the PCC

Meeting with St Peter's PCC and Archdeacon 16/04/26

The PCC held an extraordinary meeting with Archdeacon Becky Waring (and Revd Rosy Ashley) on 16th April 2026 – and we want to share some of the conversation.

The parish profile, the document we need to complete to ensure that we are in the best position for the Bishop to agree to our request to start advertising for a new minister, is underway. Becky felt the parish profile had a lot in it and we have made real progress in the last few months with regard to our increased community events, fundraising, stewardship, and generally pulling together as a church family to increase the presence of St Peter's in the community, and this is seen as a positive step.

The Diocesan property department has made positive progress with the sale of St Peter's rectory and are now actively engaged in seeking a replacement vicarage within the parish; we will receive more details about this once any purchase has been secured.

We still have work to do on the parish profile and the PCC will continue revising this in the next weeks in liaison with diocesan personnel to ensure we are attracting the right person for St Peter's. Once the parish profile is agreed the diocese can advertise the position and we can actively seek a new minister for the parish. This process will take some time to complete and the PCC and the diocesan team will be engaging with the wider congregation on various parts of the process. Please remember us all in your prayers and engage with the process as it unfolds. The PCC and the diocese really value what everyone has done within St Peter's to increase our giving, increase our parish share contribution and reach out to the community with our programme of social meeting groups, events, prayer and bible studies, quizzes, coffee shop and of course our services. This is a testament to our community and prayer life and will all go to form part of the parish profile. We would appreciate your ongoing prayers and active support in this next stage.

We need to continue to show our commitment to bring about this next stage on our pathway to a new minister and to show the key role we all play in demonstrating God's love both within and around the St Peter's church community.
